## Clarification of Cotton Planting Interval Following 0.25 Lb/Acre Active Ingredient Dicamba Application

It has been brought to our attention that information recently published in the last edition (March 18) of the Cotton Comments newsletter was unclear. In the text of the newsletter it was stated that cotton planting may occur 21 days after an application of dicamba so long as one inch of rainfall had been received within that period. This is not technically correct as stated. The graphic (of our online brochure) presented below this text states that 21 days must pass after receiving one inch of rainfall following dicamba application. This is technically correct. We apologize for any inconvenience or confusion this may have caused. ### Horseweed Control Suggestions In No-till Cotton

- ✓ Use an effective control strategy ...tank-mix with Glyphosate  
Include **1.0 lb ai/acre - 2,4-D** or **0.25 lb ai/acre - Dicamba**
- ✓ Spray when weeds are small  
**-Rosettes** are easiest to control
- ✓ Remember labeled plant back intervals  
-30 days after 2,4-D  
-21 days after 1" rainfall following Dicamba\*  
\*Do not apply Dicamba in regions receiving less than 25" of average annual rainfall.

## Public Comment Period Open for Triple-Herbicide Tolerant Cotton

Input from the public concerning the deregulation of Monsanto's dicamba/glufosinate tolerant cotton is being solicited. The dicamba/glufosinate herbicide tolerance trait will be stacked with Roundup Ready Flex technology and the trade name would be XtendFlex. USDA-APHIS has announced that the comment period opened on February 27<sup>th</sup> and closes on April 29, 2013.
